Our fall excursion takes you on an **all-inclusive** trip to the **“Heart of Dixie,”** the bustling metropolis of **Atlanta** where we explore this historical and yet very 21<sup>st</sup> Century city. This four-day getaway focuses on the vibrant art scene and rich historic sites and offers insight into the city’s development from a sleepy Deep South city to a thriving and diverse state capital and business center. Highlights include tours of the new **Atlanta Center for Civil and Human Rights**, the **High Museum of Art**, **Sweet Auburn** and the birthplace of **Martin Luther King Jr**, the **CNN Studio**, the **Georgia Aquarium** and **Atlanta’s Contemporary Art Scene**, while we sample the best of traditional and new **‘Southern Cookin’**.

**TRIP HIGHLIGHTS AND TOUR ITINERARY**

**Tuesday, October 3, Day 1**

- **United Flight #1849** depart **Newark Liberty** at **10:18AM** and arrives at Atlanta Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport at 12:53PM
- **Lunch** followed by a **Walking and Riding Highlight Tour** of the city’s history from pre-Civil War time to its current status as a leading international business center. From Buckhead, through Midtown to Downtown, Atlanta varies from modern skyscrapers to charming quiet neighborhoods.
- Check into our four-star hotel, the **W Atlanta Midtown**, 188 14<sup>th</sup> Street NE, Atlanta. Our hotel is convenient to all the best things to do in Atlanta.
- Visit the Atlanta Botanical Garden for an early evening stroll through the exhibit *The Curious Garden*. It features 14 site-specific installations created to share a story about the Garden’s plant collections and plant conservation work by prompting visitors to make a discovery, ask questions and provoke a discussion. Bold, often unexpected, manmade and altered natural materials are employed to direct the eye to focus on the simple beauty of nature. Think dozens of multi-colored spray-painted trees. A floating boat spilling oddly with lush tropical plants. A mysterious display of scientific lab glassware filled with an array of colorful liquids. Dozens of sparkly old chandeliers dripping with plants. The unique and unconventional installations are the work of guest artist and design director Adam Schwerner, Director of Horticulture at Disneyland. Our Welcome Dinner follows.

### Wednesday, October 4, Day 2

- Enjoy a docent-led visit to the **High Museum of Art**, the leading art museum of the American South. A walk through the museum's permanent collection is a journey through time and across continents. Collections consist of more than 15,000 pieces and include 19th and 20th century American and decorative art, significant European pieces, modern and contemporary art, photography, African art and folk art.
- Experience the beauty of the **Georgia Aquarium**, the largest in the western hemisphere after lunch. Get an up-close look at exotic marine life, learn about aquatic habitats and check out one of the most diverse examples of oceanic life in the world.
- Atlanta and Coca-Cola, go together like peanut butter and jelly. Explore the history of the world's most famous beverage brand at the **World of Coca-Cola**, the dynamic, multimedia home of Coke's 128-year-old secret formula. Get closer than ever to the vault that holds the secret Coca-Cola recipe. See more than 1,200 rare artifacts and get a behind-the-scenes look at the bottling process. Then take a trip around the world in a thrilling 4-D movie experience before sampling more than 100 different beverages.

### Thursday, October 5, Day 3

- Travel to the **Sweet Auburn** neighborhood, the historic **African-American** center of Atlanta where we visit the historic **Martin Luther King, Jr. National Historic Site** commemorating the life, work, and legacy of the Civil Rights leader. The center takes up several blocks which include King's boyhood home and the **Ebenezer Baptist Church**, where both King's father and grandfather served as ministers.
- Visit Atlanta's newest attraction, the **Atlanta Center for Civil and Human Rights**, a three-level 43,000-square-foot hands-on museum which offers visitors a multisensory immersion into both the U.S. civil rights movement and global human rights efforts. Its Civil Rights Movement gallery presents the brave fight for equality of the 1950s and 1960s with the exhibit *Rolls Down Like Water* bearing the mark of its curator, award-winning playwright and film director George C. Wolfe.
- Enjoy an Art Walk through **The Westside Arts District (WAD)** to view, experience, and become educated on a variety of high quality visual artworks and practices. **WAD is comprised of 6 dynamic art spaces** including **Atlanta Contemporary Art Center** which engages the public through the creation, presentation and advancement of contemporary art. Founded as a grassroots artists' cooperative, Atlanta Contemporary has become one of the Southeast's leading contemporary art centers, commissioning new works by artists and providing on-site subsidized studio space to working artists.

## Friday, October 6, Day 4

- Check out of the hotel and take an insider tour of the main newsroom of the global headquarters of CNN, the Cable News Network. This newsroom operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week. On average, there are approximately 100 people in the newsroom, but during major news events that number can exceed 200. You will get exclusive, behind-the-scenes inside look at how a live broadcast is produced and sent to viewers all over the world.
- Our final event is a visit to the Presidential Museum of the Jimmy Carter Presidential Library. Enjoy photographs and historical memorabilia from the Carter presidency (1976 - 1981) and an exact replica of the Oval Office. A permanent exhibit of significant events occurring during Jimmy Carter's life and political career includes photographs with interpretative text.
- **United flight #410 departs Atlanta at 5:41PM** and arrives at Newark Liberty at 8:13PM
