Riverside Church and The Cloisters
Wednesday, July 18, 2018

Our day starts at **Riverside Church** famous for its elaborate Neo-Gothic architecture as well as its history of social justice. We will have a **guided tour** of the art, architecture and history of this famed interdenominational institution conceived by John D. Rockefeller and listed on the National Register of Historic Places. We will leave for lunch at the **New Leaf Café** in **Fort Tryon Park** with its upscale American fare served in a cobblestone building with terrace views of the Park. After lunch we move on to the **Metropolitan Museum of Art's CLOISTERS** for a **guided tour** of the permanent collection. Following the tour you will have time to visit the first part of the HOT exhibit *Heavenly Bodies, Fashion and the Catholic Imagination*. This exhibit, sharing space in the Cloisters and the Met's **Anna Wintour Costume Center**, features a dialogue between fashion and medieval art from The Met examining fashion's ongoing engagement with the devotional practices and traditions of Catholicism. Serving as the cornerstone of the exhibition, papal robes and accessories from the **Sistine Chapel Sacristy**, many of which have never been seen outside The Vatican. There will be a **self-guided tour** as the Met is NOT offering any guided tours to this exhibition at either location.

After lunch at the **Washington Inn** we travel to the tip of Cape May's peninsula, one of the most celebrated migratory bird locations in North America and home to the **1859 lighthouse**. New York is a fashion festival this summer. We will start at the **New-York Historical Society** for a guided tour of their featured exhibition ***Walk This Way: Footwear from the Stuart Weitzman Collection of Historic Shoes***. This toe-tapping show is filled with examples from the shoe designer's extensive private collection assembled over three decades. It considers the story of the shoe from the perspectives of *collection, consumption, presentation, and production* with more than 100 pairs of shoes on view. We will lunch at a wonderful Tuscan restaurant, **Pappardella**. After, we will continue on the **Metropolitan Museum of Art** where you will have the opportunity to visit the 2nd part of the exhibit ***Heavenly Bodies, Fashion and the Catholic Imagination***. Wander through this fascinating exhibit that is split between the Met's Costume Institute and the Cloisters. This exhibit, sharing space in the Cloisters and the Met's **Anna Wintour Costume Center**, features a dialogue between fashion and medieval art from The Met examining fashion's ongoing engagement with the devotional practices and traditions of Catholicism. Serving as the cornerstone of the exhibition, papal robes and accessories from the **Sistine Chapel Sacristy**, many of which have never been seen outside The Vatican. Lyndhurst and the Union Church of Pocantico Hills
WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 8

Lyndhurst, also known as the **Jay Gould Estate**, is a Gothic Revival country house that sits in its own 67-acre park beside the Hudson River in Tarrytown, New York. The house was first named "Knoll", although critics quickly dubbed it "Paulding's Folly" because of its unusual design that includes fanciful turrets and asymmetrical outline. **Lyndhurst is opening just for our exclusive visit.** We will have a **guided tours** through this elegant mansion and the special exhibit *Becoming Tiffany: From Hudson Valley Painter to Gilded Age Tastemaker*. The exhibition features beautiful pieces from the Lyndhurst collection as well as sumptuous works loaned by major museums and rarely seen objects from private collections. Lunch will be at **Bistro Z** in the Doubletree Hotel in Tarrytown where you will dine on a delicious locally sourced meal. After lunch we continue to the **Union Church of Pocantico Hills**. This historic stone church built in 1921 by John D. Rockefeller, Jr. as part of his plans to develop the town of Pocantico Hills right near his family estate, Kykuit. As you enjoy a **special docent-led tour**, you will marvel at the colorful rose window designed by Rockefeller's wife, Abby Aldrich Rockefeller's favorite artist, **Henri Matisse** in memory of her death in 1948. When John D. Rockefeller, Jr. passed away in 1960, their children commissioned artist **Marc Chagall** to create the Good Samaritan stained glass window in his honor, which brought a dramatic combination of light and color, art and spirituality to the church.

All DAY trips depart from The Newark Museum. Parking is available in the Newark Museum lot for **\$10.00 per day.**

Many of these trips require significant walking and stair climbing. You must be able to climb on and off a bus without assistance. Please keep this in mind when formulating your travel plans.

RESERVATION POLICY

NEWARK MUSEUM MEMBERSHIP IS REQUIRED FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS.

Reservations are honored on a first come, first served basis, and must be accompanied by FULL PAYMENT and a completed reservation form.

REFUND POLICY

There is a cancellation fee of \$15.00 for all Day Trips. Cancellations must be made at least one week prior to the trip date in order to receive a refund for the cost of the trip less the \$15.00 fee.

Refunds will be made by method of payment: The museum will either credit your credit card or issue a museum check if you paid for the trip by personal check.
